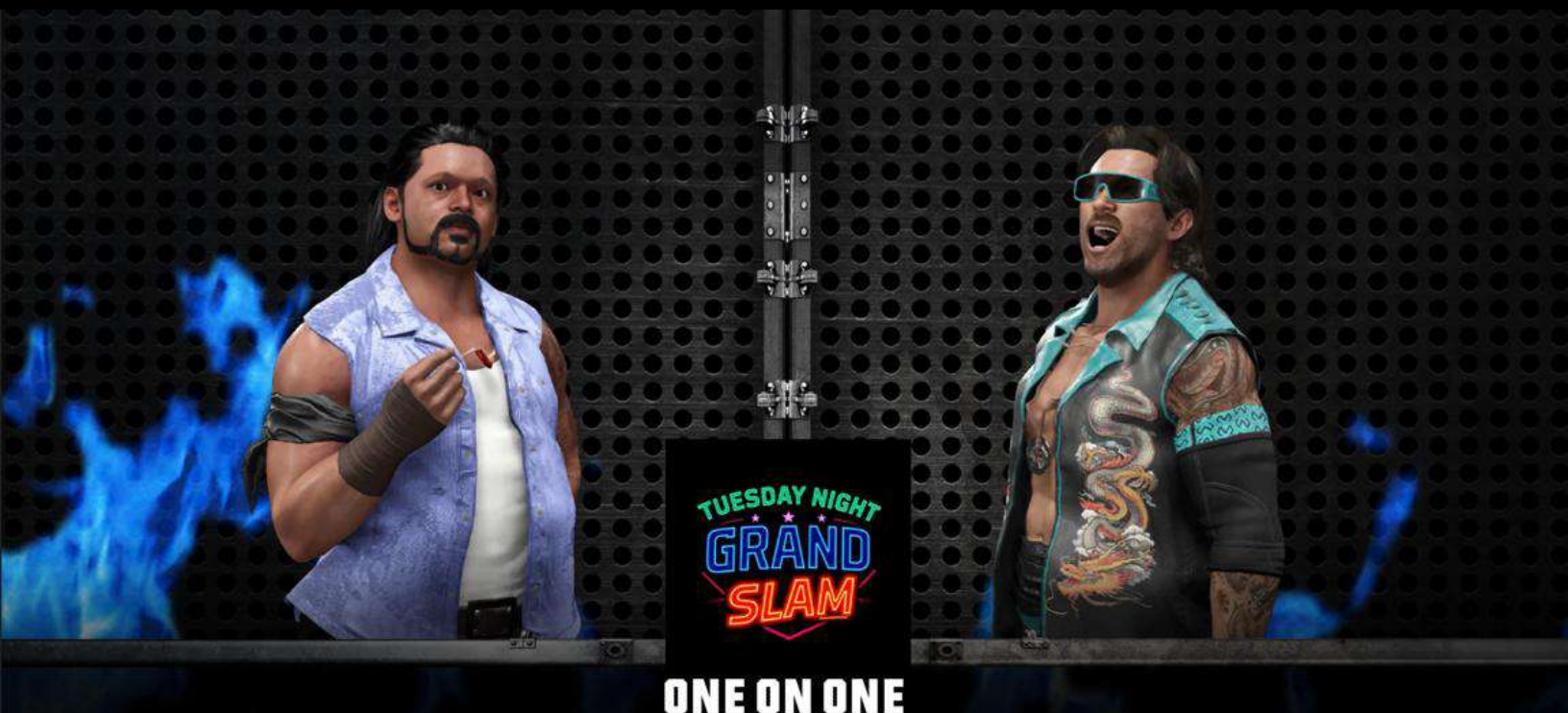

Some rivalries don't need a winner.

The bell sounded at 10:55, and the match was ruled a double count-out as both Shakespeare Williams and River Foggs remained unconscious at ringside.

Medical personnel immediately checked on both competitors before helping them regain consciousness several moments later. Neither man was able to continue, and the crowd applauded both warriors as they slowly made their way to the back under their own power.

It wasn't the ending either man wanted, but after absorbing that devastating collision with the steel post, there simply wasn't anything left.

This was a rugged, hard-hitting fight from start to finish. The double count-out felt earned because the finish came from a believable moment of desperation rather than an endless ringside brawl. Neither man was protected by luck—they were simply too battered to answer the referee's count.

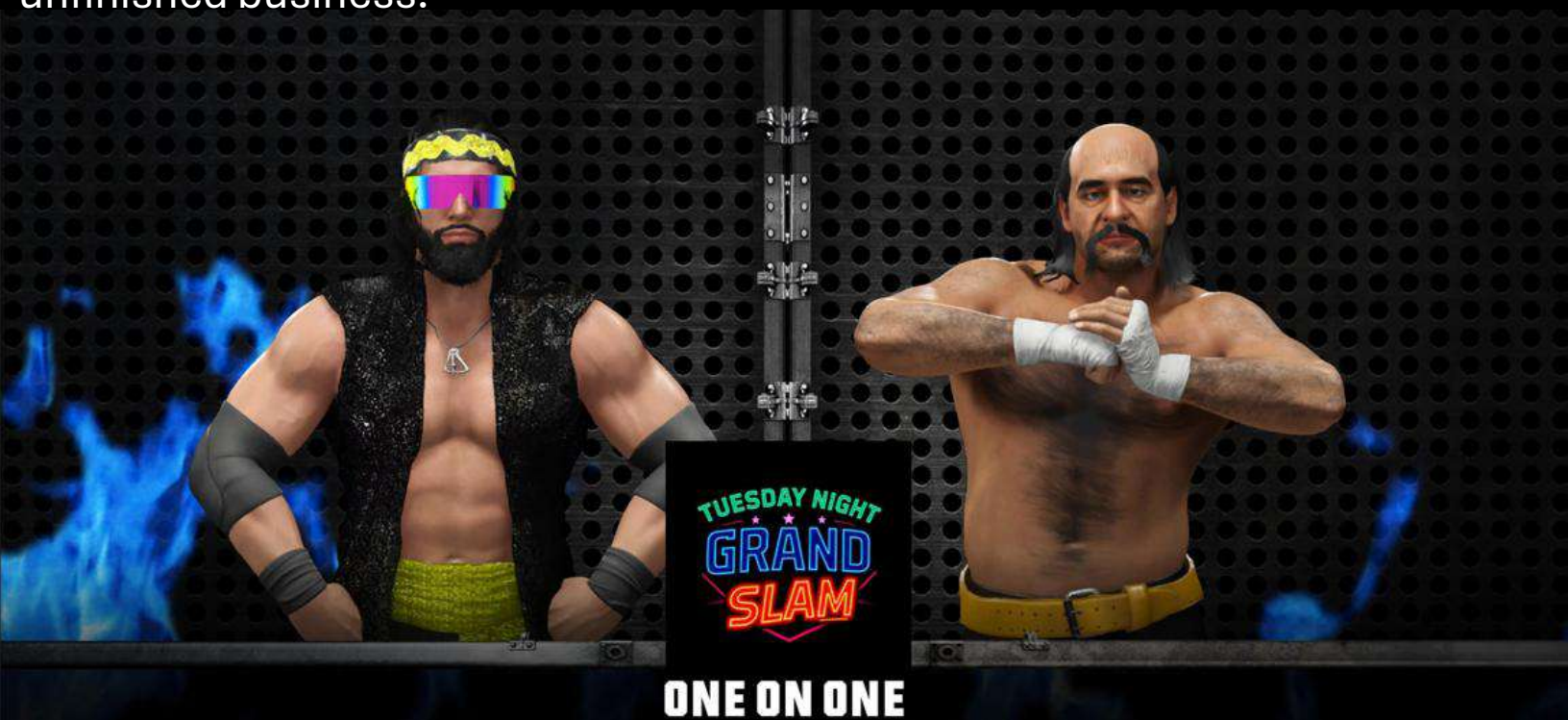

Youth Served: Jon Boden & Shane Dowell Score Career-Defining Victory Over Two BRL Legends

There are wins that pad a résumé, and then there are wins that change the trajectory of a career. On Tuesday Night Grand Slam, "Super Stud" Jon Boden and "Super Sexy" Shane Dowell accomplished the latter, stunning the veteran tandem of Shotgun James Carnage and Texas Jesse Tombstone in what may be remembered as the night two future stars officially arrived.

Going into the contest, the Regulators' legendary duo possessed every advantage imaginable. Carnage and Tombstone have built careers on grit, timing, and punishing opponents who make even the slightest mistake. Carnage nearly ended the match after leveling Boden with a devastating lariat, but Dowell broke up the pin at the last possible second. Seconds later, all four men were exchanging shots in the center of the ring as the referee struggled to restore order. Once the dust settled, Boden and Dowell struck with flawless timing, connecting with Stars Align to put James Carnage down for the three-count at 11:19.



The arena erupted.

This wasn't a fluke victory or a lucky roll-up. Boden and Dowell stood toe-to-toe with two living legends and beat them clean in the middle of the ring. For Jon Boden especially, this felt like a coming-out party. He matched Carnage's intensity throughout the contest and proved he can thrive under the brightest lights. Dowell, meanwhile, continued building an already impressive résumé, looking every bit like the cornerstone performer many believe he can become.

As for Carnage and Tombstone, a loss like this does little to tarnish their legacy. Instead, they did exactly what great veterans are supposed to do—help elevate the next generation without sacrificing the credibility they've spent years building.



If Tuesday Night Grand Slam was looking to establish its future stars, it couldn't have scripted a much better performance than this.

Tuesday Night Grand Slam Crowns Its First Champion As Punk Rock Mike Outlasts 30 Men In Chaotic Battle Royal

History was made on the first-ever edition of *Tuesday Night Grand Slam* as thirty of BRL's biggest names collided for the richest prize of the night. With \$30,000 and the inaugural Tuesday Night Grand Slam Championship hanging above every elimination, alliances formed, broke apart, and dissolved into absolute bedlam before one man stood taller than the rest. By night's end, it wasn't a member of Dynasty, Cult of Truth, or Disciples of Doom celebrating. Lenny "The Scholar" Savage quietly pieced together one of the night's strongest performances, eliminating Frandel Warpslayer, Lex Stevenson, and Hillbilly Kevin in succession. Syd Credence added notable eliminations over Joe Tusa, Andrew "Ace" Armas, and Hollywood DVS before Uncle Randy shocked the crowd by throwing Credence over the top rope, earning one of the biggest reactions of the evening.

If there was one wrestler who steadily stole the spotlight, it was Punk Rock Mike.

With the ring finally cleared of nearly two dozen competitors, the atmosphere shifted. Four men remained, and every fan in attendance knew history was only moments away. **Punk Rock Mike, Bullman Bolt, Syd Credence, and Uncle Randy** slowly circled one another in opposite corners, the crowd rising to its feet as the realization set in that the first-ever Tuesday Night Grand Slam Champion would emerge from this final showdown.

The action erupted when Bullman Bolt charged straight at Punk Rock Mike while Syd Credence locked up with Uncle Randy on the opposite side of the ring. Bolt nearly muscled Mike over the top rope with a display of raw power, but the Suburban Hell Savages veteran desperately clung to the ropes before slipping back underneath the top strand. Across the ring, Randy survived everything Syd threw at him before stunning the Æ standout with a desperate clothesline that sent Credence tumbling over the top rope to the floor.

Bullman smelled blood and rushed Mike again, only for Punk Rock Mike to duck underneath, use Bolt's momentum against him, and send the



powerhouse crashing through the ropes to the outside. Just like that, the inaugural championship came down to two battle-tested veterans: Dynasty's Uncle Randy and the most decorated member of the Suburban Hell Savages. The crowd buzzed as the finalists exchanged exhausted strikes in the center of the ring. Uncle Randy threw everything he had left at Punk Rock Mike, refusing to let another championship slip through his fingers, while Mike answered every shot with one of his own. Randy appeared moments away from victory after rocking Mike with a running clothesline near the ropes, but a last-ditch counter changed everything. Mike ducked underneath, hooked Randy's arm, and with one explosive heave sent the Dynasty veteran sailing over the top rope.

The bell rang, confetti exploded, and the building erupted.

Punk Rock Mike had done it.





Already one of the most accomplished competitors in BRL history, Mike added yet another milestone to an already incredible résumé, capturing the inaugural Tuesday Night Grand Slam Championship and the \$30,000 grand prize. If there was any debate over who sat atop the mountain heading into the second half of 2026, it ended the moment Uncle Randy hit the floor.

Within seconds, the rest of the **Suburban Hell Savages** stormed the ring. Agent 26, Brendan McFlaherty, and the rest of the group hoisted Mike onto their shoulders as streamers and confetti filled the arena. With the championship slung proudly over his shoulder, Punk Rock Mike accepted a microphone and addressed the roaring crowd.

"2026 is halfway over, but we're just getting started. This is the culmination of everything we work so hard for, and you can bet I won't be getting rid of this title without a fight. No hard feelings to Uncle Randy; he was just the last person standing in the way of me capturing another prestigious title in our great industry. Thank you to the fans... **we got 'em!**"

It was the perfect ending to a historic night—but it also felt like the beginning of something much bigger. Uncle Randy lingered at ringside for several moments after the celebration, staring back toward the ring as the Suburban Hell Savages reveled in their triumph. Whether that look was one of respect or the first spark of a rivalry remains to be seen, but if Tuesday Night Grand Slam was looking to launch its next marquee feud, **Suburban Hell Savages versus Dynasty** suddenly feels like the obvious direction.

The match never slowed down despite its enormous field, and nearly every faction had a chance to shine. A few eliminations happened too quickly to register emotionally, but the constant action and satisfying finish more than compensated. Crowning Punk Rock Mike gave Tuesday Night Grand Slam an instantly credible champion and a defining moment for the show's debut.

Now I have to ask—is Hollywood DVS interested in running it back, or is he ready to move on to bigger challenges? Then came the stunning reveal—the masked attacker was none other than "The Scholar" Lenny Savage! Ricky's own brother had officially joined the Diabolical Kingdom, giving the faction yet another dangerous weapon in its arsenal. I don't even know where to begin! The Heymans already had their hands full with Lex, Ricky, and Syd, but now they have to worry about Lenny Savage's brilliant mind tipping the scales even further. Can the Brothers Heyman overcome the numbers game, or has the Diabolical Kingdom become even more unstoppable? And, um...Mr. Lenny Savage...if you're watching...I always thought you were very scholarly. Please don't hit me with a championship belt.

Segment 13 – The McFlaherty Brothers Get an Unexpected Partner

Things took an unexpected turn for the McFlaherty Brothers before their six-man match against the Regulators. Brendan and Ruairi were convinced that "Prez" Michael Przybelewski would show up, but Commissioner Jackson announced that contract issues had kept him away and that he'd already found a replacement. Enter Joe Tusa! While the brothers were clearly frustrated with both Jackson and the situation surrounding Uncle McAllister, they welcomed Tusa as someone who isn't exactly fond of the Commissioner and who certainly knows how to fight. The big question is whether Joe Tusa can fill the shoes of Prez, even for one night. Will this unexpected trio find success against the Regulators, or will the last-minute change prove too much to overcome? One thing's for sure—the McFlaherty Brothers never seem to have a quiet week, do they?

Segment 19 – Dapper Dan's Investigation Hits a Roadblock

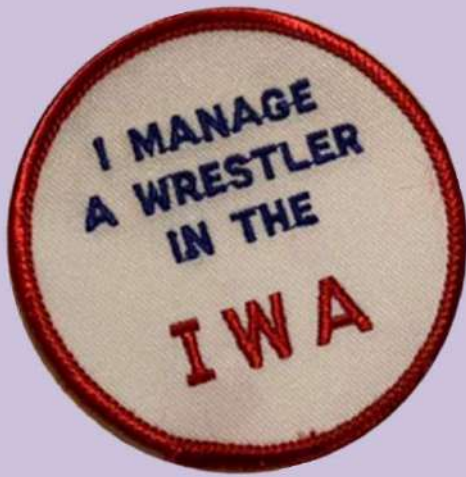

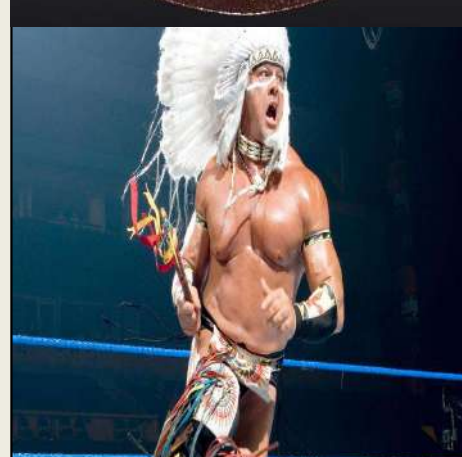

The camera fades in on the same abandoned carnival midway, but something has changed.

The Ferris wheel is no longer moving.

The carousel has stopped.

The strings of colored lights that once illuminated the midway have been switched off, leaving only one game booth glowing beneath a flickering yellow bulb. A hand-painted sign hangs above it.

KNOCK DOWN THE CHAMPION

Three wooden figures stand on a shelf behind the counter. The first wears a crude crown. The second has a black coat and an angry expression. The third and fourth are unfinished, their blank faces bearing handwritten names.

FRANDEL

LEX

A red rubber ball rolls slowly across the counter before dropping into the white-gloved hand of Boink.

The BRL North American Championship rests around his waist. His painted smile remains bright, but his eyes are unusually still.

Boink: “Everybody likes carnival games.”

He tosses the ball gently into the air and catches it.

Boink: “They look easy. That’s the trick. Three bottles. One ball. One little throw. Knock them down and win the prize.”

Boink turns toward the wooden figures.

He takes aim.

The ball leaves his hand and strikes the crowned figure directly in the chest. It tumbles backward and disappears behind the booth.

A bell rings.

DING!

Boink claps enthusiastically.

Boink: “King Khan played.”

He retrieves another ball from beneath the counter.

This one is black.

Boink: “King Khan thought he owned the carnival. He walked around like every ride belonged to him. Like every light turned on because he commanded it. Like the championship was already waiting for him on a velvet pillow.”

Boink rolls the black ball between his palms.

Boink: “Then Boink knocked the crown right off his head.”

He throws.

The second figure crashes backward.

DING!

Boink laughs, although the sound is quieter than before.

Boink: “Vic Vropta played too. Vic didn’t want the prize. Vic wanted to break the booth. He wanted to scare the man behind the counter. He wanted everyone to believe violence made him different.”

Boink leans across the counter and looks directly into the camera.

Boink: “But Boink likes violence.”

His smile widens.

Boink: “Boink just puts confetti on it.”

He reaches beneath the counter and produces two brightly colored balls. One is marked with an **F**. The other is marked with an **L**.

Boink places them side by side.

Boink: “Now Frandel Warpslayer and Lex Stevenson are standing in line. Two very serious men waiting to play a very silly game.”

He picks up the ball marked **F**.

Boink: “Frandel thinks strength solves everything. He believes if he hits hard enough, pulls hard enough, and fights long enough, eventually the world has to give him what he wants.”

Boink considers the ball for a moment.

Boink: “That sounds exhausting.”

He places it back down and picks up the ball marked **L**.

Boink: “Lex believes he can figure Boink out. Watch the hands. Study the tricks. Follow the cards. Look behind the curtain.”

Boink glances over each shoulder before lowering his voice.

Boink: “But what happens when there is nothing behind the curtain?”

A faint giggle echoes from somewhere deeper in the carnival.

Boink freezes.

For the first time, he does not appear to know where the laughter came from.

He slowly turns his head toward a darkened funhouse at the end of the midway. Its sign has lost several letters, leaving only one word illuminated.

FUN

Boink stares at it for several seconds before looking back toward the camera.

Boink: “People keep asking how Boink wins.”

He steps away from the game booth and begins walking toward the funhouse.

Boink: “Was it luck? Was it cheating? Was it magic? Did King Khan make a mistake? Did Vic Vropta lose his temper? Did somebody forget to read the rules?”

Boink stops outside the entrance.

Dozens of warped mirrors can be seen inside, each one catching a distorted reflection of his championship.

Boink: “Everybody needs an explanation because the truth makes them uncomfortable.”

He steps inside.

One mirror makes him appear ten feet tall. Another makes him short and round. Another stretches his painted smile until it covers nearly his entire face.

Boink: “The truth is Boink doesn’t need you to understand him.”

He turns toward a mirror that reflects him normally.

Boink: “Boink only needs you to underestimate him.”

His expression slowly changes.

The smile remains painted across his face, but the amusement disappears from his voice.

Boink: “Frandel and Lex have spent so much time looking at this championship that they’ve forgotten to look at the man holding it. They see the gold. They see the opportunity. They see their happy ending.”

Boink removes the North American Championship and holds it against the mirror.

Its reflection multiplies across every piece of glass surrounding him.

Boink: “But carnival stories don’t have happy endings.”

One by one, the funhouse lights begin shutting off behind him.

CLICK.

CLICK.

CLICK.

Boink: “They have winners.”

Another light dies.

Boink: “They have losers.”

The final bulb above him begins flickering.

Boink: “And they have people who leave without the prize.”

Boink places the championship back over his shoulder.

The funhouse suddenly fills with the sound of dozens of Boinks laughing at once, every distorted reflection moving independently from the real one.

Some point.

Some wave.

One stands completely still.

Boink slowly turns toward that reflection.

It is no longer smiling.

Boink: “Frandel. Lex. You wanted tickets to Boink’s show.”

He raises one white-gloved finger.

Boink: “Tickets are nonrefundable.”

A loud crash rings out from the midway.

When the camera turns back toward the game booth, both unfinished wooden figures have fallen over even though no ball was thrown.

The bell rings twice.

DING! DING!

Boink’s laughter returns as every light in the funhouse goes dark.

Boink: “Hehehehehehehe...”

A final message appears across the black screen.

THE HOUSE ALWAYS WINS.



The camera opens outside a small brick building in the industrial district just before dawn.

Rain pours steadily from a gray sky, collecting in shallow puddles across the cracked parking lot. A rusted sign above the entrance reads:

**ARMAS & ARMAS
PRIVATE COLLECTIONS**

A black sedan pulls into the lot and stops beneath a flickering security light.

The driver's door opens.

Alex Armas steps out wearing a dark coat over his training clothes. His hands are freshly taped. Andrew emerges from the passenger side carrying a thick folder beneath one arm.

Neither brother speaks as they enter the building.

Inside, the office is nearly empty.

A wooden desk sits in the center of the room. Behind it hangs a large corkboard covered with photographs, newspaper clippings, match results, and handwritten notes. Red thread connects several names and images together.

At the center are two photographs.

DARK DANGER

KING KHAN

Andrew places the folder on the desk and opens it.

The first page contains a photograph of Dark Danger interfering in the Armas Brothers' championship opportunity. Beneath it, a single word has been stamped in red ink.

OUTSTANDING

Alex removes his coat and hangs it over the back of a chair.

Alex Armas: "We gave them time."

Andrew flips to the next page.

Andrew Armas: "More than enough."

Alex walks toward the corkboard.

Alex Armas: "We didn't chase Dark Danger through the hallways. We didn't attack him in a parking lot. We didn't interrupt his interviews or hide behind management."

He reaches up and removes Dark Danger's photograph from the board.

Alex Armas: "We gave him the opportunity to do the smart thing."

Andrew leans against the desk.

Andrew Armas: "Own what he did. Stand in front of us. Explain why he decided to interfere in our business."

Alex looks at the photograph in his hand.

Alex Armas: "Instead, he stayed quiet."

He drops the image onto the desk.

Andrew Armas: "Silence doesn't erase debt."

Andrew pulls a red stamp from the folder and presses it against an ink pad.

Andrew Armas: "It increases the interest."

He stamps the page again.

DELINQUENT

Alex allows a faint smile to cross his face.

Alex Armas: "Dark Danger thought he cost us one match. That's probably how he sleeps at night. He tells himself it was one moment. One decision. One little interruption."

Alex plants both hands on the desk and looks into the camera.

Alex Armas: “But that moment had a cost. It cost us the Global Tag Team Championships. It cost us months of preparation. It cost us something that belonged to this family.”

Andrew closes the folder halfway.

Andrew Armas: “And when you take something from the Armas Brothers, we don’t ask for it back.”

He looks toward his brother.

Andrew Armas: “We take something of equal value.”

Alex nods.

Alex Armas: “Or greater.”

The rain intensifies against the windows.

Andrew moves to the corkboard and studies the photograph of King Khan.

Unlike Dark Danger’s image, Khan’s photograph is old and worn at the edges. Several dates are written beneath it. None have been crossed out.

Andrew Armas: “Then there’s King Khan.”

Alex exhales slowly.

Alex Armas: “The oldest account on the books.”

Andrew removes the photograph.

Andrew Armas: “People keep asking why we haven’t let it go. They say Khan has had other matches. Other enemies. Other championships. They say enough time has passed.”

Alex turns toward him.

Alex Armas: “Time doesn’t forgive anything.”

Andrew places Khan’s photograph beside Dark Danger’s.

Andrew Armas: “It only makes people careless.”

Alex begins circling the desk.

Alex Armas: “King Khan believes distance protects him. Every match that passes puts another wall between him and what he did. Every new opponent gives him another place to hide. Every championship pursuit gives him another excuse to pretend the past no longer matters.”

Alex stops behind the two photographs.

Alex Armas: "But the Armas Brothers remember everything."

Andrew opens a drawer and removes two plain white envelopes.

He places Dark Danger's photograph inside one.

King Khan's goes inside the other.

Andrew Armas: "No threats."

He seals the first envelope.

Alex Armas: "No warnings."

Andrew seals the second.

Andrew Armas: "No explanation."

Alex takes both envelopes and places them in the inside pocket of his coat.

Alex Armas: "Just notice."

The camera follows the brothers through a second door at the rear of the office.

Beyond it is a vast warehouse.

Rows of heavy bags hang from steel beams. Every bag has a name written across it in black marker. Some are torn open. Others have been knocked from their chains and left on the floor.

At the far end hang two untouched bags.

DARK DANGER

KING KHAN

Alex approaches the first one.

Andrew approaches the second.

Andrew Armas: "You know what separates us from everybody else?"

Alex rolls his shoulders.

Alex Armas: "Patience."

Andrew tightens the tape around his right wrist.

Andrew Armas: “Anybody can get angry.”

Alex strikes Dark Danger’s bag with a sharp left hook.

THUD.

Alex Armas: “Anybody can make promises.”

Andrew drives his shoulder into King Khan’s bag.

THUD.

Andrew Armas: “Anybody can talk about revenge.”

The brothers begin working in rhythm.

Punch.

Kick.

Elbow.

Knee.

Each strike lands with increasing force, the sounds echoing through the empty warehouse like gunfire.

Alex Armas: “But revenge isn’t anger.”

Andrew Armas: “It’s preparation.”

Alex Armas: “It isn’t a tantrum.”

Andrew Armas: “It’s a transaction.”

Alex catches Dark Danger’s bag with both hands, stopping its movement.

Alex Armas: “Dark Danger, you made the first payment when you put your hands on my brother.”

Andrew steadies King Khan’s bag.

Andrew Armas: “King Khan, your account has been open so long you probably convinced yourself we forgot where to find you.”

The brothers look at one another.

Alex gives a slight nod.

They step back at the same time.

Alex Armas: “We found you.”

Both brothers explode forward.

Alex drives a crushing forearm into Dark Danger’s bag as Andrew delivers a running knee into King Khan’s. The chains snap simultaneously.

Both heavy bags crash onto the concrete floor.

Silence returns to the warehouse.

Andrew looks down at the fallen bags.

Andrew Armas: “Two accounts.”

Alex removes the envelopes from his coat and drops one onto each bag.

Alex Armas: “One collection date.”

The brothers stand side by side as the first rays of daylight begin cutting through the warehouse windows.

Andrew Armas: “You can prepare.”

Alex Armas: “You can hide.”

Andrew Armas: “You can call it ancient history.”

Alex Armas: “You can call it none of our business.”

They step over the fallen bags and walk toward the exit.

Andrew Armas: “But when the Armas Brothers arrive...”

Alex opens the warehouse door, allowing the cold morning light to pour inside.

Alex Armas: “The talking is already over.”

The brothers disappear through the doorway.

The camera slowly pushes in toward the envelopes resting on the floor.

Stamped across both in blood-red lettering are two words:

COLLECTION DAY

The screen fades to black.

[SCENE START]

Setting: Backstage in front of the IWA banner. An interviewer holds up a microphone, but Fast Eddie Archon steps right into his space, clutching a wrinkled piece of notebook paper. He looks completely out of patience.

FAST EDDIE ARCHON:

"Shut your mouth and keep that mic close, because I've got a list here and I'm only going through it once!

First off—I'm reading the Commissioner's report, and all everybody wants to whine about is 'outside interference' from Deadly Fred when I beat Joe Tushing. Let's get one thing straight, knuckleheads: Fast Eddie Archon doesn't need help to beat a guy I already tossed over the top rope last month! Tushing is old news! Yesterday's trash!

What you saw out there wasn't 'interference'—it was a damn nature documentary! In the wild, the alpha apex predator hunts down the prey, chews it up, kills it, and then pukes it into the mouth of its young so they learn how to draw blood! I was giving Fred a teaching moment! I chewed Tushing up, spit him in Fred's face, and handed him the killer instinct!

You got a problem with that? Take it up with the big man. Fred would love another crack at you!

Eddie furiously checks the crumpled paper, squinting at the second bullet point.

Secondly! My girlfriend's got eczema right now, she's driving me absolutely out of my mind scratching, and I have zero time, zero patience, and zero energy to deal with any of the rest of you idiots in the locker room this month!

And lastly..."

Eddie glances at the bottom of the list, then looks up.

"Lastly... Deadly Fred's got something to say."

Eddie shoves the microphone into Deadly Fred's chest. Fred steps up, expanding his massive chest, hitting a front double-bicep flex that looks like it's about to burst his singlet. He snatches the microphone with a huge grin.

DEADLY FRED:

"That's right! You ready to feel the FRED-ation of—"

Fast Eddie yanks the microphone right out of Fred's hand before he can even finish the word, stepping back in front of him.

FAST EDDIE ARCHON:

"Alright, alright, that's enough! Keep your eyes open, fans... because you just might be looking at the newest, meanest tag team in the BRL... The Fred & Ed Connection!"

Eddie shoves the interviewer's face out of the frame as he starts walking off. Suddenly, a cheerful, generic ringtone goes off in Eddie's pocket.

Eddie freezes dead in his tracks. His tough-guy scowl instantly melts. He frantically digs into his tights, pulls out his phone, and checks the caller ID with wide, terrified eyes.

FAST EDDIE ARCHON:

(Voice dropping two octaves, completely sweet, gentle, and terrified)

"Hey, honey-baby! No, no, I'm done... direct to the car, right now..."

Eddie scurries off camera holding the phone to his ear with both hands while Fred shakes his head and follows behind.

[SCENE END]

Rachel Yamazaki sits alone in a dimly lit office backstage, the glow from her laptop reflecting in her glasses. Spreadsheets cover the screen—league logos, wrestler names, projections, and color-coded tabs. She never looks up.

"We'll see how all of this goes," she murmurs.

She exhales and quietly talks herself through the decision. "It wasn't the original plan, but plans exist to maximize returns, not to satisfy sentiment. Mazoku's trajectory exceeded expectations, and once a performer reaches that level you have to ask where the marginal value is greatest. Another division had a greater need, a larger upside, and better opportunities for long-term appreciation, so reallocating that asset was simply the correct business decision. It hurts this portfolio in the short term, but portfolios are measured collectively, not emotionally. The remaining question is succession. We don't need another Mazoku. Markets punish imitation. A voice comes from just outside the doorway.

Rafon stands between Pete Lagavulin and Pete Ardborg, microphone in hand.

"Ladies and gentlemen, I'm joined by the Peat Monsters, who currently hold a two-to-nothing lead in their series against the ACE Pretenders, Frandel Warpslayer and Bullman Bolt."

Lagavulin can't suppress a grin.

"Did you notice something, Michael? They're already looking for an escape hatch. Two matches down and suddenly it's excuses. Suddenly it's 'the schedule,' it's 'bad luck,' it's 'next cycle.' That's what teams do when they know the tide's already come in."

Ardberg nods and steps forward.

"Let me tell you something about this month. This isn't about stealing one more win. This isn't about surviving. This is about finishing the job. Frandel Warpslayer and Bullman Bolt can wear whatever matching gear they like and call themselves whatever clever acronym they dreamed up, but when that bell rings they're just two more lads standing between the Peat Monsters and another victory. Low Blow Lehtimäki raises a toast while Crusher Knuutila grins for the crowd, but Tiny Joronen simply stares at his championship belt. Before anyone can speak, Professor Vitali Medved marches onto the stage carrying a clipboard. "Stop! Halt this immediately! I detect statistically significant melancholy!" He points at Tiny. "You! Why is your morale coefficient below acceptable levels?" Low Blow sighs and answers, "Professor... Tiny's just sad because he can't remember how many times we've held these belts anymore." Crusher nods. "Honestly, Professor, they've stopped feeling special. We just win them whenever we want." Medved adjusts his glasses, horrified. "My magnificent Finnish specimens, this is not championship fatigue—it is the curse of sustained excellence! Alexander the Great eventually ran out of worlds. Magnus Carlsen eventually runs out of blunders to punish. You have reached the point where success has become routine, and routine is merely mastery wearing comfortable shoes. Do not mourn that the mountain no longer feels steep; celebrate that your legs have become so strong you scarcely notice the climb. One day another trio may finally take these titles from you, and on that glorious day they will discover the terrible burden of trying to equal what you have made look ordinary. Until then, raise your snapsi, wear your gold, smile like champions, and remember that true professionals do not apologize for making greatness look easy! Now, together, comrades—we shall run a traditional flow, forget the split 28s, and probably superplex hit 45!"

The arena is still covered in confetti. Gold pyro has long since burned out, but the crowd hasn't. Chants of "SHANE! SHANE! SHANE!" echo through the building as "**Super Sexy**" **Shane Dowell** stands atop the second turnbuckle, the BRL Global Championship held high above his head. Beside him, "**Super Stud**" **Jon Boden** stands proudly.

The **Alignment of Super Stars** stand at the summit.

"Well..."

Dowell smiles, looking down at the Global Championship in his hands before draping it over his shoulder.

"I guess we have our answer."

The crowd erupts.

He smiles.
"Reality."

"The race is over."
Boden shrugs.
"Actually..."
"No."
He laughs.
"The race just changed."
He points toward the locker room.
"Because every man back there isn't chasing championships anymore."
"They're chasing us."
"Congratulations, boys..."
A smirk crosses his face.
"You're all officially competing for second place."

 SHANE DOWELL

Dowell stands in the center of the ring as the cameras tighten in.
"People say success changes you."
"Not me."
"Success just proved I was right all along."
He slowly lifts the BRL Global Championship high into the air.
"I said I belonged in the main event."
"I said I would become BRL Global Champion."
"I said the Alignment of Super Stars would rule this company."
A pause.
"None of those were predictions."
"They were promises."
He looks directly into the hard camera.
"And here's another one."
"This championship isn't the end of my story..."
"It's the beginning of yours."
"Because from this moment forward..."
"Every challenger..."
"Every contender..."

"Every dream..."

"Runs through Super Sexy Shane Dowell."

He places a hand on Boden's shoulder.

"The Stars didn't just align..."

"They became the North Star."

"And whether you love us..."

"Or whether you hate us..."

"You're all following our lead now."

The Alignment of Super Stars stand side by side, the Global Championship raised high as another wave of gold pyro erupts around them. The final image isn't just of two champions.

It's of two men who promised to conquer the toughest league in the IWA...

...and did exactly that.

Meanwhile, "**Money Driven**" **Mike Sebastian** and **Thumbtack Jack** stand next to **Michael Pryzbylewski**.*

Angela Hurtz: I am here now with the **Suburban Hell Savages**. **Punk Rock Mike**, The **SHS** are coming off of a lot of difficult bouts, not limited to retaining the **BRL TV Six-Man Championships** titles. How do you feel about retaining the titles and what does the **SHS** have in mind to keep retaining those titles and earning more?

Agent 26: Wait! Wait, wait right there, **Angela**. Retaining the **BRL TV Six-Man Championships** is a feat for the ages for the **SHS**, but I believe you are missing how my brother, **Punk Rock Mike**, became the first ever **IWA Grand Slam Champion** after throwing **Uncle Randy** over the ropes to win the Battle Royal.

Punk Rock Mike: Say it loud and proud, brother. It is like I said after the battle royal. This is a culmination of everything that the **Suburban Hell Savages** has worked for and will continue to work for. And that answers your question right there, **Angela**. After every bout, win or lose, we learn and we come back that much stronger. We retained the **TV Six-Man** titles and kept going for an opportunity to make history and now here I stand as your very first **Grand Slam Champion**.

Mike Sebastian: But we're not even close to done, are we? Not only do we have the titles to hold on to, but we also have whoever attacked **Uncle McAllister**.

Agent 26: That is true, **Seabass**, and while **Uncle McAllister** is not a member of the **SHS**, a friend of the **McFlaherty Brothers** is a friend of ours. So just so it is known, **Brendan**, if you and **Ruairi** need a hand with whoever did it, you let the rest of the **SHS** know. Right **Mike**?

Punk Rock Mike: Couldn't have said it better myself, brother. We are no strangers to adversity, ambushes, and ambitious opportunists. And where there are championships, there are those who want to try to take it from the champions. I know that better than most, especially thanks to ol' **LePage Turner**. We are going to have many challengers come our way, and I am excited for each and every one of them. But they should all know just like with the **IWA Revolution Championship**, and the **BRL Global Championship**, and every single title I have held since the very beginning of my career, if you want the **Grand Slam Championship**, you better be ready to give me absolutely everything you have as we continue to show the whole world that there is no fiery spirit that burns brighter than that of the **SHS** and we do not go down without a fight!

*The rest of the **SHS** follows **Punk Rock Mike** as he walks off the screen, followed by the rest of the **SHS**, with **Angela Hurtz** watching as they leave while the screen fades to black.*

[The screen erupts into static. The picture struggles to stabilize. A single hanging light illuminates a room covered wall-to-wall with maps, newspaper clippings, handwritten notes, and red string connecting photographs that seem to have absolutely no connection whatsoever. A figure sits at a folding table. His face is completely blacked out. His voice has been electronically distorted.]



██████████: The Earth is flat. [Long pause.] Don't roll your eyes. That's exactly what THEY want. You know what else they want? For you to believe we landed on the moon. You know what happened on the moon? Nothing. Because nobody was there.

[He slaps a grainy photo onto the table.]

██████████: Look at this photograph. You see a moon landing. I see a television studio. You see astronauts. I see actors. You see history. I see a budget. [He points directly at the camera.] WAKE UP. And don't get me started on chem trails. Every morning. Every afternoon. Every evening. There they are. Lines in the sky. They tell you it's condensation. Condensation?! Have you ever seen condensation follow you for three counties? I have. I took notes. Three notebooks worth. [He holds up a stack of binders.]

[REDACTED]: Do you know how many people laughed at me? Twenty-seven. You know how many of those twenty-seven have apologized? ZERO. Because they fear the truth. [The figure stands.] Bigfoot. Area 51. Atlantis. Lizard people. Ancient aliens. The Loch Ness Monster. The Denver Airport. The mole people. [Pause.]

[REDACTED]: Especially the mole people. [He leans closer.] You think I'm crazy. Everybody always thinks I'm crazy. Until five years later when suddenly everybody starts asking the same questions I asked first. Funny how that works. [He begins pacing.]

[REDACTED]: But lately... I've discovered something. Something bigger than all of it. Bigger than the moon. Bigger than chem trails. Bigger than the lizard people. [The distorted voice lowers.] The IWAR. [Static crackles.]

[REDACTED]: At first I thought professional wrestling was safe. Just people throwing each other around. Just entertainment. Then I started looking. And once I started looking... I couldn't stop. [He points toward a massive board covered in photographs of federations, championships, commissioners, owners, and wrestlers.] You know what I've learned? Nothing in wrestling is random. Nothing. Drafts. Title shots. Tournaments. Battle royal eliminations. Contracts. Back Stage Attacks. Injuries. Retirements. All connected. Somehow. [He begins connecting random strings on the board.]

[REDACTED]: I don't know how yet. But I know they're connected. I can FEEL it. [He slams both hands on the table.] The IWAR federations are hiding something. Something enormous. Something so massive that every owner... every commissioner... every champion... is either protecting it... or doesn't even know it exists. Yet. [Long pause.]

[REDACTED]: I've spent years gathering evidence. Years. And now I've reached only one conclusion. There's only one way to uncover the truth. I have to get inside. [The figure slowly sits back down.] That's why I'm entering the IWAR Draft. Not for championships. Not for glory. Not for fame. I'm entering because somebody has to expose the biggest conspiracy in professional wrestling history. [The light flickers.]

[REDACTED]: And when I find it... when I expose it... everything changes. What is the conspiracy? [The figure chuckles.] I don't know yet. But I know it's there. [He taps the side of his head.]

[REDACTED]: The clues are everywhere. The signs are everywhere. The patterns are everywhere. Soon... I'll be inside the system. Inside the locker rooms. Inside the meetings. Inside the federations themselves. And when I find the truth... you'll all finally understand. [The figure points directly at the camera.] Question everything. Trust nobody. And whatever you do... don't believe the official story. [The screen explodes into static before COMING SOON: [REDACTED] appears on the screen. END TRANSMISSION.]

[Backstage at BRL. The camera is moving quickly through a dim hallway. The sound is chaotic before the picture fully settles — shouting, heavy footsteps, something metal clanging against the wall. The camera turns the corner. **“The Ferryman” River Foggs** and **Nocturnal Death** are already fighting. Foggs drives a forearm into Nocturnal Death’s skull mask, staggering him backward into a stack of production crates. Nocturnal Death answers with a heavy body shot, then slams Foggs shoulder-first into the concrete wall. Foggs grunts, but he does not go down. He grabs Nocturnal Death by the hoodie and rams him backward into a rolling equipment case. The case crashes sideways. Nocturnal Death barely reacts. Foggs throws another shot. Nocturnal Death blocks it. Foggs knees him in the midsection, then clubs him across the back. For the first few moments, the fight is ugly and even. Foggs is not backing down. Nocturnal Death is not slowing down. Both men trade hard shots in the hallway, knocking over cables, chairs, and boxes as BRL staff scramble out of the way.]

BRL PRODUCER: Get security! Get security back here now!

[Foggs grabs Nocturnal Death and drives him into a metal door. Nocturnal Death bounces off it, then suddenly lunges forward and drives Foggs backward. They crash into a chain-link storage rack. A heavy chain hanging from the rack swings loose. Nocturnal Death sees it. Foggs throws a right hand. Nocturnal Death ducks under it. He yanks the chain free. The sound of metal dragging across concrete cuts through the hallway. Foggs realizes too late. Nocturnal Death whips the chain across Foggs’ back.]

CRACK.

[Foggs screams and drops to one knee. A red welt immediately rises across his back. Nocturnal Death stands over him, silent. Foggs tries to push himself up. Nocturnal Death whips him again.]

CRACK.

[Another welt tears across Foggs’ back. Foggs collapses against the wall, breathing hard. Nocturnal Death tilts his head, studying the damage like he is deciding how much worse it should get. Then he lashes Foggs again.]

CRACK.

[Foggs’ body arches from the impact. The camera catches the marks across his back — long, angry welts from the chain. Nocturnal Death does not speak. He does not pose. He does not threaten. He simply keeps coming. Foggs, fighting on instinct, grabs a nearby chair and swings it wildly. Nocturnal Death absorbs the blow against his shoulder, then drives a boot into Foggs’ stomach. The chair falls from Foggs’ hand. Nocturnal Death wraps the chain around his fist and clubs Foggs across the side of the head. Foggs drops to the floor. Nocturnal Death kneels behind him. He loops the chain around Foggs’ throat. Foggs’ eyes widen. Nocturnal Death pulls back. Foggs claws at the chain, kicking his legs against the concrete. Nocturnal Death plants one knee into Foggs’ back and tightens the chain. Foggs struggles. He reaches for the wall. His boots scrape against the floor. Nocturnal Death’s masked face remains completely still. The struggle slows. Foggs’ hands weaken. His arms fall. Nocturnal Death holds the chain a few seconds

longer. Then he releases. Foggs collapses face-first onto the concrete, unconscious. Nocturnal Death slowly stands. He looks down at Foggs. Still not a word. He grabs Foggs by the back of the gear and drags him down the hallway. The camera follows. The hallway grows darker. At the end of it is a door marked:]

PAIN AND DESTRUCTION

[Nocturnal Death stops in front of the door. He lifts Foggs' limp body. Then he throws him hard into the locker room door.]

BANG.

[Foggs crashes against the door and falls in a heap at the threshold. The door flies open. **"Big Guns" Greg Garnar** storms out first, furious. Behind him comes **American Destroyer**, his face twisted with rage. They look down. River Foggs is out cold at their feet. Garnar's expression changes from anger to shock.]

BIG GUNS GREG GARNAR: River?

[American Destroyer crouches beside Foggs, checking on him. Garnar slowly looks up. At the far end of the hall stands **Nocturnal Death**. The chain hangs from his hand. He says nothing. He only stares. Garnar steps forward.]

BIG GUNS GREG GARNAR: You son of a—

[He stops. From the shadows to Nocturnal Death's left steps **Gavel Graves**. He holds a steel chair in one hand. From the opposite side steps **Vex Virelli**, also holding a steel chair, his eyes wide and his grin manic. Virelli begins to laugh. Not a normal laugh. A cracked, unstable, rising laugh that echoes down the hallway.]

VEX VIRELLI: Heh... heh-heh... hahahaha... oh, come on, gentlemen. Come on out. The courtroom is open!

[Gavel Graves raises the steel chair slightly.]

GAVEL GRAVES: Pain and Destruction. [His voice is low and heavy.] You have spent weeks striking from behind, attacking in numbers, and pretending chaos makes you untouchable. [He steps forward.] Now the defendant lies at your feet. [He points the chair toward Garnar and American Destroyer.] Step into the hallway. Come out and be judged.

[Virelli laughs louder, slapping the steel chair against his own palm.]

VEX VIRELLI: Yes! Yes! Bring the whole case out here! Bring the evidence! Bring the excuses! Bring the teeth if you have any left!

[Garnar and American Destroyer tense, ready to move. Then the camera pans slightly. Standing just beside the Pain and Destruction locker room door is **Shakespeare Williams**. He has been there the entire time. Calm. Composed. Waiting. His eyes are fixed on Greg Garnar. Shakespeare slowly steps into the frame, standing over the unconscious River Foggs.]



SHAKESPEARE WILLIAMS: Good morrow, Greg. [He glances down at Foggs.] Thy Ferryman hath reached the shore before thee. [He looks back up at Garnar.] And lo, the tide now turns against thy house.

[Garnar clenches his fists.]

BIG GUNS GREG GARNAR: You think this is funny?

[Shakespeare smiles faintly.]

SHAKESPEARE WILLIAMS: Nay. [He steps closer.] I think it poetic.

[Virelli cackles again. Gavel Graves points the chair toward the locker room.]

GAVEL GRAVES: Come out. Face sentence. Face consequence. Face Dark Verdict.

[American Destroyer helps pull Foggs partly inside the doorway, but his eyes stay locked on Nocturnal Death. Garnar looks from Nocturnal Death, to Gavel, to Virelli, to Shakespeare. For a moment, he looks ready to charge. Then he sees all four men waiting. Nocturnal Death does not move. He only raises the chain slightly. Garnar stops. Shakespeare tilts his head.]

SHAKESPEARE WILLIAMS: The stage is set, good Garnar. [He smiles coldly.] Yet still thou lingerest in the wings.

[Virelli laughs again, louder this time.]

VEX VIRELLI: Objection withdrawn! Cowardice admitted!

[Gavel Graves slams the steel chair against the wall.]

GAVEL GRAVES: Then stay in your room. [Beat.] Judgment will find you there too.

[Nocturnal Death turns away first. He drops the chain onto the concrete. The metal lands with a heavy clatter. Gavel Graves and Vex Virelli slowly back away, chairs still in hand. Shakespeare Williams remains a moment longer, staring directly at Greg Garnar.]

SHAKESPEARE WILLIAMS: At Autumn's Anarchy, our tale resumes.

[He points at Garnar.]

SHAKESPEARE WILLIAMS: And this time, sir, I write the ending.

[Shakespeare turns and walks away. The camera holds on Garnar and American Destroyer standing in the Pain and Destruction doorway with River Foggs unconscious at their feet. Down the hallway, Nocturnal Death, Gavel Graves, Vex Virelli, and Shakespeare Williams disappear into the shadows. Fade out.]



("If You Want Blood You've Got It" by AC/DC plays over the P.A. System as Pain and Destruction walks down to the ring. In the front row there is a fan dressed up like Hollywood DVS. He is pointing and yelling at PAD. PAD pulls him over the barricade and starts punching and kicking him. Security runs down to ringside. After several minutes they finally get PAD to stop and they climb into the ring.)

"Big Guns" Greg Gagnar: What just happened here is your fault, Hollywood DVS. This moron thought he could be tough by dressing up like you and running his mouth. Now, you think you're funny by some of the innuendos you made

towards PAD?! We don't think you're funny at all.

Dark Verdict and Shakespeare Williams. You want to talk about the numbers game. How you have the advantage. You see, PAD is like the wolves hiding in the woods, waiting for the lamb to get separated from the herd. Then we attack. You or Dynasty can't stay together 24 hours a day. We will be waiting. Shakespeare Williams, you remind me of a character in a Shakespeare play. His name is Puck, and he is a fairy. He goes around causing problems, then he hides behind people.

I'm making a challenge to any member of Dynasty and any member of Dark Verdict and Shakespeare Williams to a match one-on-one. Any time, anywhere, and any kind of match. Anyone brave enough to accept?



American Destroyer: PAD went driving through the hills looking for Hillbilly Kevin's house. We found it, but he wasn't home. Instead, his smelly, toothless wife came out to the car. She wanted us to take her away from there. She wanted to get in the car, but we wouldn't let her. We told her we wasn't taking her anywhere! Trouble at home, Kev?
