Death Valley Drifter – Upset over being eliminated from the Battle Royal by Vekktor, Death Valley Drifter feels disrespected and vows to remind everyone exactly who he is. Rather than accepting the elimination, he promises to make Vekktor recognize his reputation the next time they meet.

Magnifico Astro – Astro briefly recaps his opening victory over Sam Hain, admitting that winning by countout wasn't ideal but emphasizing that a victory still counts. With the first match behind him, his attention turns confidently toward the next chapter of their series.

Los Astros (Ultimo & Excelente) – Following a victory over Los Americanos, Los Astros acknowledge that the win didn't bring them any closer to reclaiming the Tag Team Championships they once held. Despite that frustration, they remain determined, insisting they'll eventually find their way back to the top of the division.

Starlyte analyzes the threat while management officially announces the upcoming match. Agent Sweater vows to unravel the Sockes, but Swampy confidently accepts the challenge, promising that their pursuer will finally learn why nobody squeezes a Socke. The segment mixes comedy, AI analysis, and over-the-top storytelling to build anticipation for their showdown.

Sensational Scott Foley – Foley boasts that he was the lone bright spot for his team, claiming he carried everyone else while Red Reign and The Reinhardt repeatedly failed. He publicly distances himself from teammates he considers dead weight and declares that, moving forward, he only wants to compete alongside proven winners capable of finishing the job themselves.

The Challenge of Starlyte – This promo focuses less on attacking opponents and more on criticizing the managers who continually overlook Starlyte despite his accomplishments. It argues that everyone is too consumed with their own stories to recognize the reigning League Champion, insisting that while they may ignore him, they can never deny his success.

TRASH TALK

Adam Michaels – Michaels says defeating Magnifico Astro felt satisfying but believes Astro never truly respected him, even years earlier. Admitting that his obsession with beating Astro distracted him from championship goals, he now vows to expose the entire Astro family as wrestlers living off their famous name before pursuing bigger prizes.

Father Conrad & Padre Arturo – The reigning Tag Team Champions celebrate another successful title defense, declaring themselves the rightful champions in the eyes of a higher power. Conrad rants about the unworthy challengers surrounding them before Arturo calms him, reminding him that even greater opportunities are likely on the horizon.

Soo Yoo-Pai – After a disappointing event, Soo immediately looks ahead instead of dwelling on the loss. He announces a series against Ali Atari to further cement his legacy before revealing that he has entered the IWAR Draft. The segment ends humorously as his partners misunderstand what draft he meant, but Soo reassures them they'll be fine while he pursues his own ambitions.

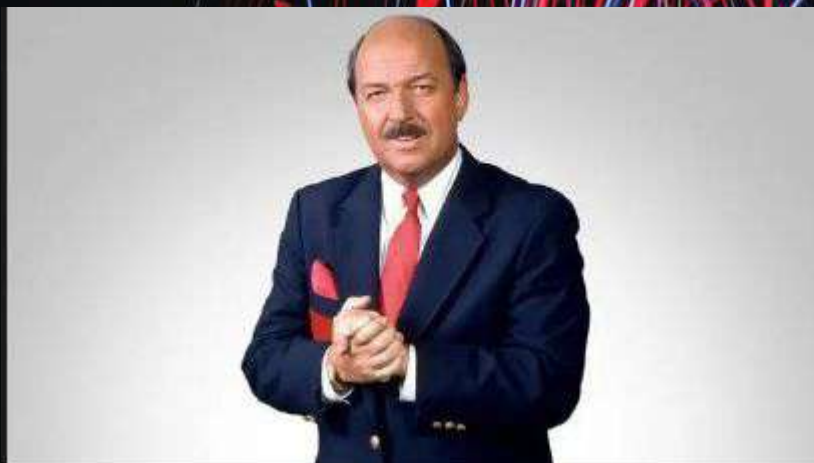

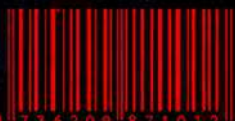

One week after leaving EDGE, Zulu was back on the email chain. A member named "This something" laid into him for no reason after he asked to be removed. Just the start...

A couple months later, EDGE leadership tried rigging the Flame Wars tournament results to keep ACE (including Zulu) from advancing. Childish. Petty.
- THE RETURN & THE RIVALRIES**
After a 1.5 year break, Zulu returned and message board battles with EDGE members—especially Hannibal—exploded across the game.
- TZ vs. HANNIBAL 2007-2011**
Hannibal is the only manager to defeat Tommy Zulu twice in a series. The war of words was as thick as it could get.
- TZ vs. SLY SMITH 2010-2011**
The top feud in the game. Top two-ranked managers both years. Zulu briefly joined AE in 2010 before things imploded—and the gloves came off.
- THE 2011 TURNING POINT**
Zulu's abrupt departure ended feuds, shattered 75, and reignited EDGE. They don't catch AE then, but that campaign became the foundation for their future dominance.

MORE HISTORY. MORE RIVALRIES. MORE CHAPTERS TO COME NEXT CYCLE!

The cameras once again open inside the luxurious conference room of the Arrogant Empire estate. Stephanie Gallows sits across from "the Forever Champ" Tommy Zulu as the familiar black-and-gold AE banner hangs in the background.

GALLOWES: "Welcome back to another IWA Network exclusive. Tommy, before we continue our discussion about your history with EDGE, let's get everyone caught up on your Forever Series Challenge. Last cycle wasn't exactly the breakthrough you were hoping for. You're still trailing GDP in your IWL series, you've fallen behind Big Rye in the three-federation Triple Threat Series, and Caleb Crawdad has taken the early lead in your BOTB semifinal."

ZULU: "Yeah, it wasn't the scoreboard I was looking for. What's frustrating is that it wasn't because I got blown out. We had a ton of matches that came right down to the wire. Tiebreakers. One-vote swings. Coin-flip type results. Those are the ones that sting because you know you're right there. But close only counts in horseshoes and hand grenades. Right now I'm trailing all three series, and if I want to come out the other side, I've gotta be better."

GALLOWES: "Despite the slow start, you still seem pretty upbeat about where things stand."

ZULU: "How could I not be? Think about what we're watching unfold right now. At what other point in the history of this game are you gonna find the #1-ranked manager simultaneously locked into series against the #2-ranked manager and the #3-ranked manager while also battling the all-time single-season points leader? That's insane. This is exactly what fantasy wrestling is supposed to be. The best competing against the best with something meaningful on the line. It's exciting, and I just happen to be fortunate enough to be standing right in the middle of it."

GALLOWES: "Last cycle we left off with your departure from EDGE. You said you accepted what you viewed as a career opportunity with ACE, but that the reaction wasn't exactly positive. What happened?"

ZULU: "Well, one story pretty much sums up the atmosphere. About a week after I left, I somehow wound up back on the EDGE email chain. Honest mistake. So I replied to let everybody know I was still on the distribution and that they probably wanted to remove me. That was it. Just a courtesy."

GALLOWES: "Seems reasonable enough."

ZULU: "You'd think so. Instead, one of the members—I think her name was Thea or something like that—absolutely unloaded on me. Just nasty for no reason whatsoever. I'm sitting there thinking, 'I was literally trying to help you guys.' It was my first indication that maybe not everybody saw my departure the way I did."

GALLOWES: "Did things calm down after that?"

ZULU: "Not really. A couple months later came the Flame Wars Tournament. From where I was sitting, EDGE leadership decided to get pretty petty. They started manipulating votes to make sure ACE members—including me—weren't advancing. Whether they thought they were protecting their own or trying to send a message, it didn't really matter. It was childish. Looking back now, it was probably insignificant in the grand scheme of things, but at the time it really established the tone for what my relationship with portions of EDGE was going to look like over the next several years."

GALLOWES: "Eventually you stepped away from the game altogether."

ZULU: "For about a year and a half. But, when I returned, the old EDGE really wasn't EDGE anymore. People had scattered into different groups. There were a couple startups, there was that short-lived smiley-face group that didn't exactly light the world on fire, and everybody was kind of finding their footing again. But one thing picked right back up where it had left off. Hannibal and I had some unbelievable battles between about 2007 and 2011. To this day he's still the only manager who's beaten me twice in a series. That's a distinction nobody else has. But honestly, if you ask me what I remember most from that rivalry, it isn't the series. It's the message boards."

GALLOWES: "The war of words?"

ZULU: "Oh yeah. It seemed like every other week one of us was taking a shot at the other. We couldn't have been more different in how we approached the game, and that rivalry became incredibly personal from a competitive standpoint. There was genuine respect because we kept showing up against each other, but there wasn't much agreement on... well... anything else."

GALLOWES: "As heated as that rivalry was, there was another feud developing around the same time with Sly Smith."

ZULU: "Yep. In 2010 I joined Sly's stable—the Arrogant Empire—for what turned out to be a very short stay. Things unraveled pretty quickly and I left. After that, the gloves came off."

GALLOWES: "You and Sly occupied the top two spots in the rankings for much of 2010 and 2011."

ZULU: "We did, and the rivalry reflected it. Every week felt important. Every result mattered. Every post on the boards turned into another chapter of the story. Looking back, it was probably the defining feud of that era."

GALLOWES: "Then, in the fall of 2011, you unexpectedly left the game."

ZULU: "I did, and that changed everything."

GALLOWES: "How so?"

ZULU: "Well, my departure obviously ended my feuds with Sly and Hannibal overnight. But it also reshaped the stable scene. I had become part of a startup group called 7S that had a ton of momentum behind it. People were excited about what we might become. When I left, that momentum disappeared and 7S eventually fell apart. Meanwhile, EDGE suddenly had new life. They spent the rest of that year trying to chase down AE. They came up short, but when I came back nearly a decade later, I realized something. Those years after I left had become the foundation for what EDGE eventually became. They built on that 2011 momentum and turned themselves into the dominant stable in the game for almost my entire absence."

GALLOWES: "So while your story with EDGE paused, theirs continued."

ZULU: "Exactly. And when I finally came back, I was stepping into a very different landscape than the one I'd left behind. Different in almost every way conceivable."

GALLOWES: "Which sounds like the perfect place to pick up next cycle."

ZULU: "It is. We've covered the early chapters. Next time we'll get into the modern era—my return to the game, reconnecting with old friends and rivals, and how everything eventually led to the Forever Series Challenge we're watching play out today."

GALLOWES: "I look forward to it. Tommy Zulu, thank you again for your time."

ZULU: "Pleasure was all yours, Steph."

The cameras fade to black as the Æ banner fills the screen.

[The screen erupts into static. The picture struggles to stabilize. A single hanging light illuminates a room covered wall-to-wall with maps, newspaper clippings, handwritten notes, and red string connecting photographs that seem to have absolutely no connection whatsoever. A figure sits at a folding table. His face is completely blacked out. His voice has been electronically distorted.]



██████████: The Earth is flat. [Long pause.] Don't roll your eyes. That's exactly what THEY want. You know what else they want? For you to believe we landed on the moon. You know what happened on the moon? Nothing. Because nobody was there.

[He slaps a grainy photo onto the table.]

██████████: Look at this photograph. You see a moon landing. I see a television studio. You see astronauts. I see actors. You see history. I see a budget. [He points directly at the camera.] WAKE UP. And don't get me started on chem trails. Every morning. Every afternoon. Every evening. There they are. Lines in the sky. They tell you it's condensation. Condensation?! Have you ever seen condensation follow you for three counties? I have. I took notes. Three notebooks worth. [He holds up a stack of binders.]

[REDACTED]: Do you know how many people laughed at me? Twenty-seven. You know how many of those twenty-seven have apologized? ZERO. Because they fear the truth. [The figure stands.] Bigfoot. Area 51. Atlantis. Lizard people. Ancient aliens. The Loch Ness Monster. The Denver Airport. The mole people. [Pause.]

[REDACTED]: Especially the mole people. [He leans closer.] You think I'm crazy. Everybody always thinks I'm crazy. Until five years later when suddenly everybody starts asking the same questions I asked first. Funny how that works. [He begins pacing.]

[REDACTED]: But lately... I've discovered something. Something bigger than all of it. Bigger than the moon. Bigger than chem trails. Bigger than the lizard people. [The distorted voice lowers.] The IWAR. [Static crackles.]

[REDACTED]: At first I thought professional wrestling was safe. Just people throwing each other around. Just entertainment. Then I started looking. And once I started looking... I couldn't stop. [He points toward a massive board covered in photographs of federations, championships, commissioners, owners, and wrestlers.] You know what I've learned? Nothing in wrestling is random. Nothing. Drafts. Title shots. Tournaments. Battle royal eliminations. Contracts. Back Stage Attacks. Injuries. Retirements. All connected. Somehow. [He begins connecting random strings on the board.]

[REDACTED]: I don't know how yet. But I know they're connected. I can FEEL it. [He slams both hands on the table.] The IWAR federations are hiding something. Something enormous. Something so massive that every owner... every commissioner... every champion... is either protecting it... or doesn't even know it exists. Yet. [Long pause.]

[REDACTED]: I've spent years gathering evidence. Years. And now I've reached only one conclusion. There's only one way to uncover the truth. I have to get inside. [The figure slowly sits back down.] That's why I'm entering the IWAR Draft. Not for championships. Not for glory. Not for fame. I'm entering because somebody has to expose the biggest conspiracy in professional wrestling history. [The light flickers.]

[REDACTED]: And when I find it... when I expose it... everything changes. What is the conspiracy? [The figure chuckles.] I don't know yet. But I know it's there. [He taps the side of his head.]

[REDACTED]: The clues are everywhere. The signs are everywhere. The patterns are everywhere. Soon... I'll be inside the system. Inside the locker rooms. Inside the meetings. Inside the federations themselves. And when I find the truth... you'll all finally understand. [The figure points directly at the camera.] Question everything. Trust nobody. And whatever you do... don't believe the official story. [The screen explodes into static before COMING SOON: [REDACTED] appears on the screen. END TRANSMISSION.]
